Advanced Practice RNs were categorized according to the title by which they are officially recognized by the South Carolina Board of Nursing. In the small number of cases where an APRN holds more than one officially recognized title, the first title recognized was used.












Educational Mobility Among RNs

Progress Toward BSN and Higher Degree Goals

In 2014, 46% of the RN and APRN nursing workforce in South Carolina held a baccalaureate degree or higher. Nationally, 51% of the RN workforce held a baccalaureate or higher degree that year (CCNA, Dashboard Indicators) The Institute of Medicine goal for 2020 is to have 80% or more of the national RN workforce with a baccalaureate or higher degree. In South Carolina the goal is to have 50% or more by 2020.






















