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# Introduction

This publication provides information about both the health status of the population in South Carolina and the number of healthcare professionals actively practicing across the state. This information is presented in several different ways:

- area summary tables reporting the number of healthcare professionals with a primary practice in that area, the age and racial profile of the population in that area, a selection of vital statistics and health status indicators for that area, information about healthcare facilities, and a selection of statistics related to socio-economic conditions that are closely associated with healthcare status and outcomes
- maps showing the distribution of healthcare professionals by the zip code location of their primary practice setting
- maps showing the concentration of healthcare professionals having their primary practice in each county, relative to the population in that county
- tables which show, for each county in the state, the total number of healthcare practitioners who report having either their primary or secondary practice location within that county

This information has been compiled by the South Carolina Office for Healthcare Workforce in the South Carolina AHEC program office housed at the Medical University of South Carolina. We are a neutral entity dedicated to coordinating the development and publication of workforce policy-relevant research across the spectrum of health professions in South Carolina. Funded by the state of South Carolina, our primary goal is the development and analysis of accurate, reliable information on the supply of healthcare professionals and the demand for health services in South Carolina in order to support a wide array of workforce planning efforts.

# Sources and Limitations of the Data

#### Health Professions Data

The health professions data used in this report are collected every other year during the license renewal process by the regulatory boards that oversee each of the following professions: Certified Nurse Anesthetists, Certified Nurse Midwives, Clinical Nurse Specialists, Dental Hygienists, Dental Technicians, Dentists, Licensed Practical Nurses, Nurse Practitioners, Occupational Therapists, Occupational Therapy Assistants, Optometrists, Pharmacists, Pharmacy Technicians, Physical Therapists, Physical Therapy Assistants, Physician Assistants, Registered Nurses, and Respiratory Care

Practitioners. The data collection process is organized and administered through the South Carolina Department of Labor, Licensing and Regulation, Division of Professional and Occupational Licensing Boards. Although the specific data elements collected during the renewal process are slightly different for each licensed group, each licensure database includes basic demographic, practice, and location information for each of the healthcare profession groups included in this book.

The South Carolina Revenue and Fiscal Affairs Office, Health and Demographics Section (RFA-HDS) is the official repository for statistical data relating to licensed health professionals in South Carolina. The RFA-HDS provided the summary counts of healthcare providers for each county in the state and by primary practice site zip code used to create the maps and tables in this report. Regional aggregations were computed by the staff of the South Carolina Office for Healthcare Workforce.

The maps included in this publication are based on either the county or zip code in which a provider reported having his or her primary practice, that is, the practice site in which they spend the majority of their time.<sup>1</sup> The dot density maps, based on primary practice site zip codes, are intended to convey how our healthcare workforce is concentrated or distributed throughout the state. The dots in the maps are randomly assigned within the zip code borders and do not reflect the actual location of providers in the way that street-level address information might do. However, using zip codes rather than county location improves the quality of information being conveyed by making use of geographic areas smaller than the county. The second set of maps, based on the county location of the provider's primary practice, show how concentrated a particular health profession is, relative to the size of the population, at the county level.

#### **Definitions and Limitations**

State law requires that practitioners in each of the health professions profiled in this report obtain a license to practice.<sup>2</sup> However, counting all practitioners with an active license to practice would overstate the size of the actual workforce. Healthcare practitioners may change their work status over time from full to part time; by temporarily leaving the workforce to care for family members; by retiring; by moving to another state but maintaining their South Carolina license; or by maintaining their license but working in another field. To avoid that problem, *the counts of licensed healthcare professionals reported here include only those individuals holding an active license to practice and actively practicing in their field within the state of South Carolina.* Note that this definition may include educators, researchers and administrators who do not engage in direct patient care but are still actively engaged in their profession and the workforce.

The result may be a conservative count of the healthcare workforce due to the fact that new licensees (those immigrating into South Carolina from another state, or new graduates receiving their initial license to practice in South Carolina) may not be required to report their employment or practice status in their initial license application, and thus might not be captured in the workforce definition until they have gone through the license renewal process. Depending on when a new licensee receives their initial license to practice, they may be a productive part of the workforce for as much as two years before they are reflected in official workforce counts. However, established healthcare providers also retire, die, or leave practice every day

for a variety of reasons as well. These two groups tend to balance each other out in a stable workforce. Understanding whether a specific health profession is growing or shrinking requires tracking these in- and out-migrations over time.

The time periods on which our workforce counts are based differ for each professional group. The license renewal process occurs on a biennial cycle (every two years). The Department of Labor, Licensing and Regulation, Division of Professional and Occupational Licensing Boards administers license renewals in South Carolina. Timelines for license renewal are specified within the practice acts of each professional group, with different groups renewing at different times of the year. This produces a staggered effect in the data collection periods. As a result, it is not possible to produce a true 'snapshot' of the healthcare workforce in South Carolina at a single point in time. And the fact that licensee information is updated on a biennial cycle for the majority of health professions makes it difficult to get a truly accurate count of the workforce since people are both entering and leaving the workforce over that two year time period.

The table below shows the time periods during which information was gathered for each of the groups included in this report. Some regulatory boards may allow a grace period that, in effect, extends the license renewal period beyond the official end date. The data provided by the RFA-HDS for this report allows an additional two-month period beyond the last day of the renewal in order to account for processing time or periods of grace that may have been extended by the regulatory boards.

Previous versions of this data book have counted the physician workforce based on the number of physicians who have their <u>primary</u> practice site in the state. However, a small number of physicians may have their primary practice located outside of the state but have a secondary practice site within South Carolina. This is especially true when a large city such as Charlotte is located on the state's border. Beginning with this version of the SC Health Professions Data Book we will be counting every physician with a practice site in South Carolina as among the state's physician workforce, <u>except for those employed in military or federal facilities which serve the armed services community</u>. The physician workforce in 2015 contained a total of 12,182 physicians available to the civilian population (including physicians in residency training programs) actively practice located within South Carolina at the time of their license renewal: 12,172 of them reported having their <u>primary</u> practice located within South Carolina.

For the purposes of this report, doctors of medicine (MDs) and doctors of osteopathy (DOs) are grouped together. Both types of physicians are awarded the same privilege to practice by the South Carolina Board of Medicine. Physicians are classified by their self-reported specialty area. Physician counts include physicians involved in post-graduate medical (residency) training programs. Resident physicians who hold an active license to practice in the state contribute a significant amount of care to South Carolina citizens. The 1,736 residents who were actively practicing in the state at the time this information was collected made up 14.3% of the entire physician workforce.

The 295 physicians whose primary practice is in federal or military facilities and who indicate their employer as "Federal, Military" or "Federal, Civilian" are designated in this report as Federal Physicians and are not included in any 'total physicians' count. They have been broken out as a separate category in the report tables and maps, which is common practice in workforce analysis. However, physicians who reported their employer as Federal, but had their primary practice in a federally-qualified community health center or rural health center are counted among the civilian physician workforce, because they provide services to the civilian population.

#### **Population Data Source**

Information on area population by age and race is from the U.S. Census Bureau 2015 abridged race post-census estimates released by the National Center for Health Statistics. County level age and race summary tables were provided by the Health and Demographics Section of the Revenue and Fiscal Affairs Office. Regional aggregations were created by the South Carolina Office for Healthcare Workforce staff.

#### Demographic, Health Facility and Economic Data


This publication also includes information on different types of health status in the population; vital statistics such as births, deaths and pregnancies; hospital and nursing home beds in an area; hospital discharges within resident's home county; and socio-demographic indicators for the area population such as unemployment, education, income and insurance coverage. Definitions of each statistic and its source can be found in Appendix I: *Data Definitions and Sources*.

In addition to reporting information at the county level, data has also been aggregated into regional summaries. There are several different regional definitions included in this book that are used by one or more governmental agencies for planning or program implementation purposes. These include: AHEC regions, DHEC planning regions, perinatal care regions, and Workforce Investment Board regions. We also include two different definitions of the urban and rural areas of our state. The source and definitions for each regional categorization can be found in Appendix I, while a list of the counties included in each region can be found in Appendix II: *Regional Definitions*.


## **Recent Changes in the Healthcare Workforce in South Carolina**

The two charts on the following pages summarize the percentage change and numeric change in the different occupational groups profiled in this book. The changes are measured over the period from 2010 to 2015 which encompasses a four year period of change for each professional group. Percentage growth patterns are influenced greatly by the size of the group under study – smaller groups who gain a small number of new entrants may show a large percentage gain, while larger groups that gain the same number of new entrants will show a much smaller percentage gain. In order to understand both the proportionate growth of groups within the South Carolina health workforce, as well as the numeric growth in those groups, compare the information in the two charts.


# Percentage change in the size of selected occupations in the healthcare workforce in South Carolina 2010 - 2015




### Total Physicians in South Carolina by Primary Practice Location





### Concentration of Total Physicians Per 10,000 Population





# Family Practice Physicians in South Carolina by Primary Practice Location





### Concentration of Family Practice Physicians Per 10,000 Population





### Internal Medicine Physicians in South Carolina by Primary Practice Location





### Concentration of Internal Medicine Physicians Per 10,000 Population






### Concentration of Obstetric / Gynecology Physicians Per 10,000 Population




### Concentration of Pediatric Physicians Per 10,000 Population



# General Surgery Physicians in South Carolina by Primary Practice Location





### Concentration of General Surgery Physicians Per 10,000 Population






### Concentration of All Other Physician Specialists Per 10,000 Population





### Concentration of Federal Physicians Per 10,000 Population





## Registered Nurses in South Carolina by Primary Practice Location





## Concentration of Registered Nurses Per 10,000 Population







## Concentration of Certified Nurse Midwives Per 10,000 Population







#### Concentration of Nurse Practioners Per 10,000 Population







## Concentration of Certified Nurse Anesthetists Per 10,000 Population







## Concentration of Clinical Nurse Specialists Per 10,000 Population







## Concentration of Licensed Practical Nurses Per 10,000 Population







#### Concentration of Dentists Per 10,000 Population







## Concentration of Dental Hygienists Per 10,000 Population







#### Concentration of Dental Technicians Per 10,000 Population







#### Concentration of Pharmacists Per 10,000 Population







## Concentration of Pharmacy Technicians Per 10,000 Population







## Concentration of Physical Therapists Per 10,000 Population







#### Concentration of Physical Therapy Assistants Per 10,000 Population






## Concentration of Occupational Therapists Per 10,000 Population




## Concentration of Occupational Therapy Assistants Per 10,000 Population





## Concentration of Physician Assistants Per 10,000 Population







## Concentration of Respiratory Care Practitioners Per 10,000 Population









Resident Births - The number of all births recorded in 2015. Births are allocated to the county of the mother's residence. Regional aggregate counts were calculated by the South Carolina Office for Healthcare Workforce from county-level figures.

Resident Deaths - The number of all deaths recorded in 2014. Deaths are allocated to the county of residence of the decedent. Source: Data were generated and downloaded September 23, 2016 from the SC DHEC SCAN website: <u>http://scangis.dhec.sc.gov/scan/bdp/tables/death2table.aspx</u>. Regional aggregate counts were calculated by the South Carolina Office for Healthcare Workforce from county-level figures.

**Total Pregnancies Number and Rate** - The total number of pregnancies is an estimate based on the sum of live births, abortions, and fetal deaths. Rates are calculated per 1,000 women age 15 – 44 in the area. Data reported here are from 2014.

Note that state-wide pregnancy counts and rates include information not assigned to any specific county, and thus the sum of the county figures do not sum to the state-wide totals. This also affects regional area figures which are based on the sum of the counties included in each region. Pregnancies which are included in the state-wide totals but are not assigned to a specific county are thus not included in the regional area sums.

Teen pregnancies which are included in the state-wide totals but are not assigned to a specific county are thus not included in the regional area sums.

**Cancer Deaths** – All deaths resulting from cancer in 2014, based on death certificate data.

**Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance Survey data** - Many of the health status indicators presented in this book are based on data collected in the South Carolina section of the Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance Survey sponsored by the Centers for Disease Control. This edition of the data book reports county-level estimates generated by pooling 4 years of BRFSS data: 2011 to 2014. County, state and regional-level data was provided by the DHEC Office of Public Health Statistics and Information Services. For those counties with a sample size less than 200 data was not provided and the DHEC regional statistic was reported instead for that county. In the case of Perinatal regions, the Spartanburg region was too small to calculate accurate statistics so the values in the Greenville region were assigned to Spartanburg region by the OHW staff. The following measures of health status were all drawn from this source:

% of Adults Diagnosed with Heart Disease - This is the percentage of adults who answered Yes to: "Has a doctor, nurse, or other health professional EVER told you that you had angina or coronary heart disease?" in the Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance Survey in South Carolina.

% of Adults Diagnosed with Hypertension - This is the percentage of adults who answered Yes to: "Have you ever been told by a doctor, nurse or other health professional that you have high blood pressure?" in the Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance Survey in South Carolina.

% of Adults Diagnosed with Diabetes - This is the percentage of adults who answered Yes to: "Have you EVER been told by a doctor that you have diabetes?" in the Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance Survey in South Carolina.

% of Adults Who Currently Smoke - This number is calculated from the Smoking Risk Factor statistic to determine current smoking status among adults, based on responses to the Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance Survey in South Carolina.

**% Reporting a Sedentary Lifestyle** - This is the percentage of adults who answered No to: "During the past month, other than your regular job, did you participate in any physical activities or exercises such as running, calisthenics, golf, gardening, or walking for exercise?" in the Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance Survey in South Carolina.

% of Adults Overweight or Obese (BMI > 25) – This percentage is based on a calculated risk factor for obesity derived from self-reports of Body Mass Index greater than 25 for adults age 20 and over in the Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance Survey in South Carolina.

#### Healthcare Facilities

**General Hospital Beds** – The number of general use hospital beds in licensed hospitals. The bed count does not include specialty care beds such as those dedicated to neonatal intensive care, psychiatric, rehabilitation or substance abuse services.

#### Socio-Economic Factors

% of Adults Without Health Insurance – The Small Area Health Insurance Estimates (SAHIE) program of the U.S. Census Bureau produces and disseminates model-based estimates of health insurance coverage for counties and states. The SAHIE program models health insurance coverage by combining survey data with population estimates and administrative records. SAHIE estimates are based on data from the following sources: American Community Survey (ACS); demographic population estimates; aggregated federal tax returns; participation records for the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP); County Business Patterns; Medicaid and Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP) participation records; and Census 2010. The American Community Survey (ACS) insurance question asks "Is this person currently covered by specifically stated health insurance or health coverage plans?" This question replaces the Current Population Survey (CPS) question that was used in prior releases which asked "At any time during the previous year" was the person covered? Note that coverage solely by the Indian Health Service (IHS) does not count as health insurance; i.e., people who were only covered by IHS in the previous year are counted as uninsured.

**Per Capita Income** - Personal income is the income that is received by persons from all sources. It is calculated as the sum of wage and salary disbursements, supplements to wages and salaries, proprietors' income with inventory valuation and capital consumption adjustments, rental income of persons with capital consumption adjustment, personal dividend income, personal interest income, and personal current transfer receipts, less contributions for government social insurance. Per capita income is calculated as the personal income of all residents in a given area divided by the resident population of that area. In computing per capita personal income, the Bureau of Economic Analysis uses the Census Bureau's annual midyear population estimates.

#### **Regional Definitions**

Area Health Education Centers (AHECs) - The South Carolina AHEC system encompasses four independent regional centers and a central program office. It functions as a cooperative effort of the Medical University of South Carolina, the University of South Carolina, South Carolina community teaching hospitals, the four regional AHEC Centers and the system program office. AHEC implements programs designed to: increase the number of young people who aspire to become healthcare professionals, emphasizing underrepresented ethnic minority groups and the economically disadvantaged; facilitate clinical rotations for health professions students in rural and underserved areas; increase the physician workforce by sponsoring graduate medical education residency training programs; enhance clinical

competence by providing educational programs for healthcare providers at or near their workplace; and increase the healthcare workforce by maintaining programs to recruit and retain primary care providers.

**Health Professional Shortage Areas (HPSAs)** - The federal Health Resources and Services Administration Shortage Designation Branch within the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services identifies geographic areas, population groups, or facilities which have unmet healthcare needs as Health Professional Shortage Areas (HPSA). These designations provide a means of prioritizing where limited federal resources should be focused. HPSA designations are granted in three areas: primary medical care, dental care and mental health. A HPSA designation may affect an entire county (labeled as "whole"), a population subgroup within a county, or a facility which serves the public within a county (labeled as "partial"). When no geographic area, population group, or public facility within a county has been defined as a HPSA then the HPSA designation for that county is labeled as "none" in this book.

**Workforce Investment Board Regions** - The State Workforce Investment Board (SWIB) provides direction to the South Carolina Department of Employment and Workforce on workforce development issues, particularly those pertaining to implementation of the Workforce Investment Act. Twelve regional Workforce Investment Boards work directly with local businesses, agencies and other partners to deliver services and programs. These regional boards provide oversight of the Workforce Investment Act in their area and oversee local SC Works Centers which include a variety of workforce partners and programs.

**Metropolitan Statistical Areas (MSAs) -** Metropolitan and micropolitan statistical areas are geographic entities defined by the U.S. Office of Management and Budget (OMB) for use by Federal statistical agencies in collecting, tabulating, and publishing Federal statistics. A metro area contains a core urban area of 50,000 or more population. A micropolitan area contains an urban core of at least 10,000 but less than 50,000 population. Each metro or micro area consists of one or more counties and includes the counties containing the core urban area, as well as any adjacent counties that have a high degree of social and economic integration with the urban core (as measured by commuting to work). Any county that is not designated a metropolitan or micropolitan area is designated as a non-metro area. Revised every 10 years, the designations reported in this book, released in February, 2013, are based on 2010 census counts.

**Rural / Urban Areas -** The definition of rurality in this book is based on U.S. Census Bureau information about the percentage of county residents living in urbanized areas. Counties in which 50% or more of the population lives outside of an urban area or urban cluster are defined as "rural" in this book.

An urbanized area consists of densely developed territory that contains 50,000 or more people. An urban cluster consists of densely developed territory that has at least 2,500 people but fewer than 50,000 people. Geographic entities, such as metropolitan areas, counties, minor civil divisions, places, and census tracts often contain both urban and rural territory, population, and housing units. Based on results of the 2010 Census, the Census Bureau classified all territory, population, and housing units located within urbanized areas (UAs) and urban clusters (UCs) as "urban." (See the definition of MSAs above for more information.) In general, these urban territories consist of areas of high population density and urban land use resulting in a representation of the "urban footprint" within a geographic area. Rural areas in a county are defined as all territory, population, and housing units located outside of urban areas and urban clusters.
