APRN MONTHLY MEETING: HPV VACCINATION UPDATE FOR PROVIDERS

Goal/Purpose:

According to the Center for Disease Control, about 33,000 cases of cancer are found in parts of the body where HPV (Human Papillomavirus) is found. HPV causes about 26,800 of these cancers. Each year in the US, about 17,600 women and 9,300 men get cancers linked with HPV. Providers should be equipped with latest CDC guidelines and recommendations in order to provide optimal care and information to patients and parents of minor patients. Please join Dr. Benjamin Elder, Pediatrician and Assistant Professor of McLeod Family Residency Program and Director of Children's Health Information, as he addresses this issue while familiarizing you with the most up to date information in the administration of the HPV vaccine.
