Goal/Purpose:

Population Health is the term du jour in healthcare. This SCHOOLS program will explore the operational structure driving the most recent evolution in clinical care. Tenets of Population Health including the transition from volume pricing to value based payments and how this impacts the delivery of care will be covered.
