Identification and Management of Autism Spectrum Disorder in Young Children

January 22, 2018 | 3:00pm-4:00pm

Description:

This SCHOOLS presentation is brought to you through a partnership with SC LEND. This presentation will review the characteristics and behavioral signs of autism spectrum disorder (ASD) among children, a neurodevelopmental disorder that now affects 1 in 68 young children in the United States. Strategies for screening for ASD will be discussed, including specific screening tools and approaches for discussing ASD with parents and families. Lastly, recommendations for management and treatment of young children at high-risk for autism spectrum disorder will be reviewed, including referrals for evaluation and early intervention.
