

Virtual Summer Careers Academy Expectations & Requirements

The Summer Careers Academy expects/requires participants to:

1. Submit documentation of a negative one-step tuberculosis (TB) skin test administered by a certified healthcare practitioner within six months of the start of the Summer Careers Academy as a part of the Medical University of South Carolina's TB Infection Control Plan. All costs associated with TB test administration are assumed by the participant.
2. Complete online trainings as assigned and submit required documentation by the published deadlines.
3. Fully engage in all Summer Academy programming that extends 7:45 am to 10:00 pm (approximate) each day.
4. Decline participation in any programs, classes, employment and/or activities that require the participant to be absent from didactic, clinical, service and/or project development experiences associated with the Summer Careers Academy, or requires the participant to leave the Virtual Academy.
5. Dress in business casual attire for all Academy activities, unless otherwise noted by Academy staff (no tank/strapless/spaghetti strapped tops).

The South Carolina AHEC does not and shall not discriminate on the basis of race, color, religion (creed), gender, gender expression, age, national origin (ancestry), disability, marital status, sexual orientation, or military status in any of its activities or operations.

Commitment to Students with Disabilities

Participant Duties & Requirements

Physical Requirements: Ability to lift up to 10 pounds (occasionally) or negligible amounts (frequently); Ability to walk and stand (frequent); Ability to sit (continuous); Ability to maintain 20/40 vision, corrected, in one eye or with both eyes (continuous); Ability to maintain hearing acuity, with correction (continuous); Ability to perform fine manipulation with fingers and hands (occasional); Ability to use technology equipment and software – personal computer, laptop, projector, digital cameras and software such as Microsoft Office PowerPoint (frequent); Ability to work within time constraints and frequent change of tasks (frequent); Ability to work closely with others as part of a team (continuous); Ability to participate in tedious or rigorous work (continuous); Ability to participate in daily activities 7:45 am-10:00 pm, approximate (continuous).

Learning Conditions

Overall Learning Conditions: Good: Relatively free from unpleasant environmental conditions or hazards.

Environmental Factors: Potential daily exposure to extreme temperature, wetness and/or humidity.

Health and Safety: Potential of exposure to bloodborne pathogens, hazardous chemicals and latex.

Primary Work Location: Academic environment, health-related workforce sites.

Protective Equipment Required: Closed toe shoes.

Accommodations
