

# Women and Addiction



## DESCRIPTION

The purpose of this workshop is to increase knowledge about women and the influence that a substance use disorder will have on their lives. Women who have a substance use disorder are likely to be impacted in ways that are different than men. In particular, the intersection of gender, race and class creates obstacles and challenges for women in the areas of treatment and recovery. These obstacles will be explored and recommendations for successful approaches will be identified.

## OBJECTIVES

*Upon completion of this program, the participant should be able to:*

1. Demonstrate knowledge of unique issues and challenges impacting women with a substance use disorder.
2. Identify the biological issues that lead to negative outcomes, both physically and socially, for addicted women.
3. Explain how the ways in which the social environment and gender in particular, impact women differently in identification, treatment and ongoing support for recovery.
4. Identify and differentiate strategies that are empirically supported in treating women with a substance use disorder.
5. Demonstrate self-awareness about personal attitudes and feelings toward women who have a substance use disorder.
