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Learning Outcome:

At least 80% of the participants will display improved knowledge of the identified body systems, their primary functions, and the diseases, both acute and chronic, that are associated with each system. This increase in knowledge will allow for more appropriate management strategies for the nurse in the school environment.

Description:

School nurses provide care for students with acute and chronic illness, including medication and treatment administration; educating students to improve disease knowledge, increase independence, and their ability for self-care. The school nurse also manages both physical injuries and mental health conditions. They do this all in a setting with very few tools for assessment, limited privacy, scarce resources, and generally, very limited clinical support. In this learning activity, five body systems will be covered discussing their primary functions and associated diseases.
