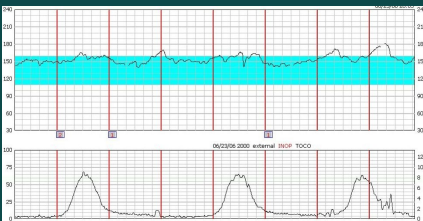

DESCRIPTION

This introductory course provides a basic level of understanding and competence in electronic fetal heart monitoring for nurses new to Women's Services.
