COURSE DESCRIPTION

OBJECTIVES

3. Identify several different Spiritual Assessment tools and how they function.
4. Identify Spiritual needs and address these spiritual needs appropriately.
5. Observe and recognize Cross-cultural variations in the Experience, Expressions, and understanding of grief, therefore better serving the patient in their times of need.
6. Gain knowledge about the Diversity of persons in the hospital setting and how that influences the chaplain's ministry.
7. Discuss how much self-awareness plays an important part in ministering effectively to others.
8. Review how important it is to let the patient lead the path and help the patient find their own resources.
