Dying, Death and its Aftermath

This course is designed for those who care for the dying and those who go on living after a death. Participants will learn practical skills and techniques useful to those who are navigating the painful and disorienting path of death.

- 5. Prepare for some of those unexpected issues that arise when someone dies.
- 6. Explain from firsthand accounts, what to say and what not to say in the volatile atmosphere surrounding a death.
