



COURSE DESCRIPTION

This class takes you beyond the basics of bandages and ice packs to dive into the real-world scenarios you face every day as a school nurse. Topics covered include GI illnesses, tracheostomy care, assessing substances, and basics of first aid care.



LEARNING OUTCOMES

At the conclusion of this program, each participant will be able to:

- List at least three types of eating disorders.
- Develop a care plan with at least three appropriate nursing interventions for eating disorder patients.
- Define constipation and identify at least three causes in school-aged children.
- Determine when to recommend referral to a pediatrician for signs of acute otitis media.
- Perform an otoscopic assessment safely, meeting at least 4 out of 5 steps on a checklist.
- Accurately describe steps to record a student's blood pressure using the correct technique.
- Identify at least three risk factors and two symptoms of hypertension in adolescents.
