DESCRIPTION

This comprehensive course provides rehab professionals with an indepth understanding of the evaluation and treatment of cervical and thoracic spine dysfunction. - 4. Interpret clinical findings to categorize patient presentations (e.g., mechanical neck pain, radiculopathy, cervicogenic headache).
- 5. Apply evidence-based manual therapy techniques such as joint mobilization including HVAT where appropriate, soft tissue techniques, and neuromuscular facilitation.
- Implement functional movement, postural, and ergonomic interventions to optimize patient performance and reduce recurrence.
- Design an effective home exercise program to ensure lasting improvements.
