Purpose: Diabetic foot problems are among the most common, costly and severe complications of diabetes. Diabetes can reduce blood circulation and damage the nerves in the feet.

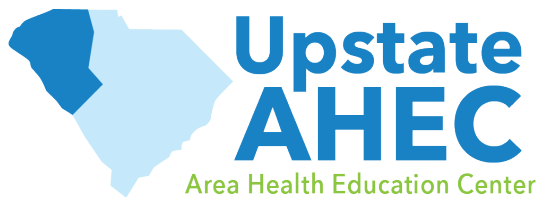
Target Audience: Nurses or anyone interested in the topic.
