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South Carolina Health Professions Data Book

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Introduction

This publication provides information about both the health status of the population in South Carolina and the number of healthcare professionals actively practicing across the state. This information is presented in several different ways:

- area summary tables reporting the number of healthcare professionals with a primary practice in that area, the age and racial profile of the population in that area, a selection of vital statistics and health status indicators for that area, information about healthcare facilities, and a selection of statistics related to socio-economic conditions that are closely associated with healthcare status and outcomes
- maps showing the distribution of healthcare professionals by the zip code location of their primary practice setting
- maps showing the concentration of healthcare professionals having their primary practice in each county, relative to the population in that county
- tables which show, for each county in the state, the total number of healthcare practitioners who report having either their primary or secondary practice location within that county

This information has been compiled by The Office for Healthcare Workforce Analysis and Planning in the South Carolina AHEC Program Office, Medical University of South Carolina. We are a neutral entity dedicated to coordinating the development and publication of workforce policy-relevant research across the spectrum of health professions in South Carolina. Currently funded by The Duke Endowment, our primary goal is the development and analysis of accurate, reliable information on the supply of healthcare professionals and the demand for health services in South Carolina in order to support a wide array of workforce planning efforts.

Sources and Limitations of the Data

Health Professions Data

The health professions data used in this report are collected every other year during the license renewal process by the regulatory boards that oversee each of the following professions: Certified Nurse Anesthetists, Certified Nurse Midwives, Clinical Nurse Specialists, Dental Hygienists, Dental Technicians, Dentists, Licensed Practical Nurses, Nurse Practitioners, Occupational Therapists, Occupational Therapy Assistants, Optometrists, Pharmacists, Pharmacy Technicians, Physical Therapists, Physical Therapy Assistants, Physicians, Physician Assistants, Registered Nurses, and Respiratory Care Practitioners. The data collection process is organized and administered through the South Carolina Department of Labor,

Licensing and Regulation, Division of Professional and Occupational Licensing Boards. Although the amount of data collected during the renewal process is slightly different for each licensed group, each licensure database includes basic demographic, practice, and location information for every healthcare professional licensed to practice in the state.

The South Carolina Budget and Control Board Office of Research and Statistics (ORS) is the official repository for statistical data as it relates to health professionals licensure information in South Carolina. The ORS provided the summary counts of healthcare providers for each county in the state used to create the maps and tables in this report. Regional aggregations were computed by the staff of the Office for Healthcare Workforce Analysis and Planning.

The maps included in this publication are based on either the county or zip code in which a provider reported having his or her primary practice, that is, the practice site in which they spend the majority of their time.¹ The dot density maps, based on primary practice site zip codes, are intended to convey how our healthcare workforce is concentrated or distributed throughout the state. The dots in the maps are randomly assigned within the zip code borders and do not reflect the actual practice location of the providers in the way that street-level address information might do. However, using zip codes rather than county location improves the quality of information being conveyed by making use of geographic areas smaller than the county. The second set of maps, based on the county location of the provider's primary practice, show how concentrated a particular health profession is, relative to the size of the population, at the county level.

Definitions and Limitations

State law requires that practitioners in each of the health professions profiled in this report obtain a license to practice. For that reason, the data reported here are based on an accurate count of the supply of licensed practitioners. However, because practitioners may change their work status over time by temporarily leaving the workforce to care for family members, by retiring, moving to another state but maintaining their South Carolina license, or maintaining their license but working in another field, simply counting the number of licensed individuals could be misleading. To avoid that problem, the counts of licensed healthcare professionals reported here include only those individuals holding an active license to practice and actively practicing in their field within the state of South Carolina. Note that this definition may include educators, researchers and administrators who do not engage in direct patient care but are still actively engaged in their profession.

The result is a conservative count of the healthcare workforce due to the fact that new licensees (those immigrating into South Carolina from another state, or new graduates receiving their initial license to practice in South Carolina) may not be required to report their employment or practice status in their initial license application, and thus would not be captured in the workforce definition until they have gone through the license renewal process. Depending on when a new licensee receives their initial license to practice, they may be a productive part of the workforce for as much as two years before they are reflected in official workforce counts. However, it is also true that healthcare providers retire, die, or leave practice for a variety of reasons every day as well. These two groups tend to balance each other out in a stable workforce. Understanding whether a specific health profession is growing or shrinking requires tracking these in- and out-migrations over time. Future

versions of this report will be able to include those analyses.

The time periods on which our workforce counts are based differ for each professional group. The license renewal process for each of the health professions occurs on a biennial cycle. The South Carolina Department of Labor, Licensing and Regulation, Division of Professional and Occupational Licensing Boards governs license renewals in South Carolina. However, the timelines for license renewal are specified within the practice acts of each professional or occupational licensing board. This produces a staggering effect in the data collection periods, meaning that it is not possible to produce a true 'snapshot' of the healthcare workforce in South Carolina at a single point in time. And the fact that data is updated on a biennial cycle rather than an annual cycle makes it more difficult to get a timely estimate of the workforce since people are constantly entering and leaving the workforce.

The table on the previous page shows the time periods during which information was gathered for each of the groups included in this report. Some regulatory boards may allow a grace period that, in effect, extends the license renewal period beyond the official end date. Such allowance policies vary from one regulatory board to another. Currently it is not possible to assess the impact such grace periods might have on the counts reported here, but it is assumed such impact would be small.

For the purposes of this report, doctors of medicine (MDs) and doctors of osteopathy (DOs) are grouped together. Both types of physicians are awarded the same privilege to practice by the South Carolina Board of Medicine. Physicians are classified by their self-reported specialty area. Physician counts include physicians involved in post-graduate medical (residency) training programs. Resident physicians, who hold an active license to practice in the state, contribute a significant amount of care to South Carolina citizens. The 1,289 residents who were actively practicing in the state at the time this information was collected made up 12.7% of the entire physician workforce.

Physicians whose primary practice is in federal or military facilities and who indicate their employer as "Federal, Military" or "Federal, Civilian" are designated in this report as Federal Physicians. They have been broken out as a separate category, which is common practice in workforce analysis. However, those physicians who reported their employer as Federal, but had their primary practice in a federally-qualified community health center or rural health center are counted among the civilian physician workforce, and are not designated as Federal in this report. The table below shows the types of settings in which the physicians designated in this report as "Federal" were practicing at the time this data was gathered. It should be noted that federal physicians practicing in government facilities are not required to be licensed by the South Carolina Board of Medicine. Therefore, our count of federal physicians most likely falls short of the actual number practicing in the state.

Population Data Source

We used 2009 population figures rather than the newer 2010 census numbers because many of the health status and economic indicators included in this report were measured during 2009. The 2009 population estimates were downloaded from the Missouri Census Data Center on August 4, 2011 using their "Population Estimates by Age" interactive table builder that produces a detailed data table of population broken down by county, race and age. The original source of these data is the special "bridged race" estimates created by the U.S. Census Bureau for the National Center for Health Statistics (NCHS).


Demographic, Health Facility and Economic Data

This publication also includes information on health, vital statistics, hospitals and nursing homes, and socio-demographic data. Definitions of each statistic and its source can be found in Appendix I: Data Definitions and Sources. The statistics on cancer deaths, percentage of adults with heart disease, hypertension, diabetes, and those who currently smoke, have a sedentary lifestyle or are overweight or obese were all drawn from results of the Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance Survey in South Carolina. In order to improve the estimates at the county level, data was pooled from the 2008, 2009 and 2010 survey responses to produce the county-level estimates in this book. Regional and state-level estimates are based on the 2010 survey results.

The count of hospital beds includes general beds only and does not include beds reserved for specialty care such as neonatal intensive care units, psychiatric, rehabilitation, or substance abuse. The bed count for skilled nursing facilities includes both regular nursing home beds and institutional beds. Both the hospital and nursing home bed counts are based on published reports by the DHEC Division of Health Licensing cited in Appendix I. The hospital discharge information was calculated from in-county and out-of-county discharges in 2009 from the SC Hospital Discharge System database to illustrate the percentage of county residents that were able to receive hospital care within their home county.

Socio-economic data on adults without health insurance, households with incomes under \$25,000, and percentage of the population with a high school education or less were based on data collected through the Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance Survey in South Carolina and pooled from the years 2008, 2009, and 2010 to avoid problems with small sample sizes at the county level.

In addition to reporting information for each county in the state, the information has also been aggregated into regional summaries. There are several different regional definitions included that are used by one or more governmental agencies for planning or program implementation purposes, such as the AHEC regions, the DHEC regions, and perinatal regions. We also include two different definitions of the urban and rural areas of our state. The source and definitions for each regional categorization can be found in Appendix I, while a list of the counties included in each region can be found in Appendix II: Regional Definitions.




Total Physicians in South Carolina by Primary Practice Location



Concentration of Total Physicians Per 10,000 Population




Family Practice Physicians in South Carolina by Primary Practice Location





Concentration of Family Practice Physicians Per 10,000 Population





Internal Medicine Physicians in South Carolina by Primary Practice Location





Concentration of Internal Medicine Physicians Per 10,000 Population





Obstetric / Gynecology Physicians in South Carolina by Primary Practice Location





Concentration of Obstetric / Gynecology Physicians Per 10,000 Population





Pediatric Physicians in South Carolina by Primary Practice Location






General Surgery Physicians in South Carolina by Primary Practice Location









Concentration of All Other Physician Specialists Per 10,000 Population





Federal Physicians in South Carolina by Primary Practice Location



Concentration of Federal Physicians Per 10,000 Population




Registered Nurses in South Carolina by Primary Practice Location





Concentration of Registered Nurses Per 10,000 Population





Certified Nurse Midwives in South Carolina by Primary Practice Location





Concentration of Certified Nurse Midwives Per 10,000 Population





Nurse Practitioners in South Carolina by Primary Practice Location



Concentration of Nurse Practitioners Per 10,000 Population




Certified Nurse Anesthetists in South Carolina by Primary Practice Location



Concentration of Certified Nurse Anesthetists Per 10,000 Population




Clinical Nurse Specialists in South Carolina by Primary Practice Location





Concentration of Clinical Nurse Specialists Per 10,000 Population





Licensed Practical Nurses in South Carolina by Primary Practice Location





Concentration of Licensed Practical Nurses Per 10,000 Population





Dentists in South Carolina by Primary Practice Location



Concentration of Dentists Per 10,000 Population




Dental Hygienists in South Carolina by Primary Practice Location





Concentration of Dental Hygienists Per 10,000 Population





Dental Technicians in South Carolina by Primary Practice Location





Concentration of Dental Technicians Per 10,000 Population





Pharmacists in South Carolina by Primary Practice Location



Concentration of Pharmacists Per 10,000 Population





Concentration of Pharmacy Technicians Per 10,000 Population




Physical Therapists in South Carolina by Primary Practice Location



Concentration of Physical Therapists Per 10,000 Population











Occupational Therapists in South Carolina by Primary Practice Location





Concentration of Occupational Therapists Per 10,000 Population





Occupational Therapy Assistants in South Carolina by Primary Practice Location











Respiratory Care Practitioners in South Carolina by Primary Practice Location





Optometrists in South Carolina by Primary Practice Location









Appendix I: Data Definitions and Sources

Regional Definitions

Area Health Education Centers (AHECs) - Area Health Education Centers (AHECs) are academic and community partnerships that provide health career recruitment programs for K-12 students and increase access to health care in medically underserved areas. The South Carolina AHEC develops and supports programs designed to increase the number of young people who aspire to become healthcare professionals, emphasizing underrepresented ethnic minority groups and the economically disadvantaged; facilitate clinical rotations for health professions students in rural and underserved areas; increase the physician workforce by sponsoring graduate medical education residency training programs; enhance clinical competence by providing educational programs to healthcare providers near their workplace; and increasing the healthcare workforce by maintaining programs to recruit and retain primary care providers. In South Carolina, the AHEC Program Office supports 4 regional centers which collectively serve all areas of the state.

Health Professional Shortage Areas (HPSAs) - The federal Health Resources and Services Administration Shortage Designation Branch within the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services identifies geographic areas, population groups, or facilities which have unmet healthcare needs as Health Professional Shortage Area (HPSA). These designations provide a means of prioritizing where limited federal resources should be focused. HPSA designations are granted in three areas: primary medical care, dental care and mental health. Because HPSA designations rely on county boundaries, a HPSA may encompass an entire county (designation = whole), or only part of a county (designation = partial). When no geographic area or population group within a county has been defined as a HPSA then the county designation is "none".

Perinatal Regions - Perinatal assessment regions support a geographically structured approach to assuring risk-appropriate care for all mothers and infants with a goal of improving perinatal outcomes and reducing infant mortality. There are four perinatal regions and five regional perinatal centers in SC: Low Country Region, Medical University of South Carolina; Pee Dee Region, McLeod Regional Medical Center; Midlands Region, Palmetto Richland Memorial Hospital; Piedmont Region, Greenville Hospital System and Spartanburg Regional Medical Center.

Metropolitan Statistical Areas (MSAs) - Metropolitan and micropolitan statistical areas are geographic entities defined by the U.S. Office of Management and Budget (OMB) for use by Federal statistical agencies in collecting, tabulating, and publishing Federal statistics. A metro area contains a core urban area of 50,000 or more population. A micropolitan area contains an urban core of at least 10,000 but less than 50,000 population. Each metro or micro area consists of one or more counties and includes the counties containing the core urban area, as well as any adjacent counties that have a high degree of social and economic integration (as measured by commuting to work) with the urban core. Any county that is not designated a metropolitan or micropolitan area is designated as a non-metro area.
